Please remember that it is fine for parents to discuss how their child/children is/are going at school anytime, just make an appointment with their teacher.

NAPLAN tests are next term during Week 2. While all students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 are expected to participate some students can be exempted for specific reasons (Disabilities, etc) and parents may withdraw children if they believe the tests will cause great anxiety or they object to the tests. If unsure whether this may be the case for your child please discuss with your child's teacher. Parents need to sign a form outlining this decision. Forms are available from Front Office.

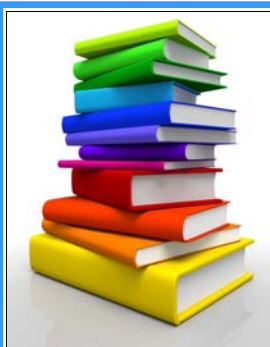

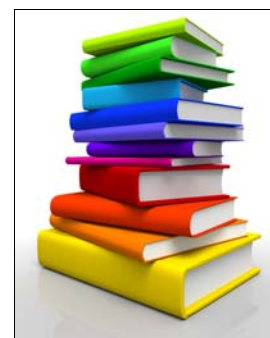

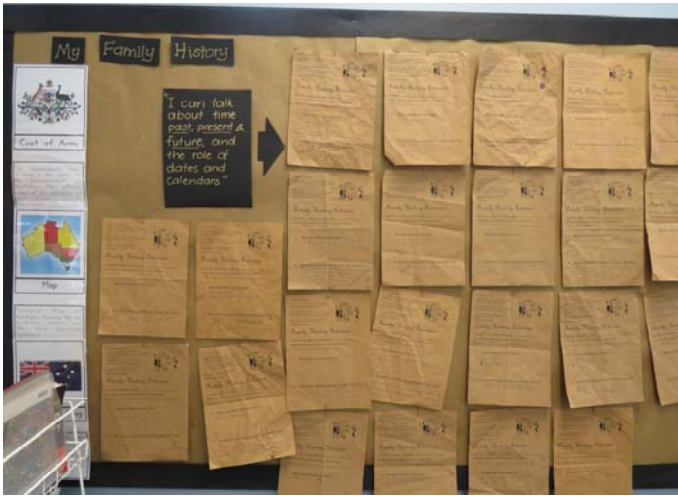
We would also like to thank everyone who donated goods for this year's Cake Stall with a wonderful variety on offer, this raised \$575.05
