from the Principal's Desk

Year 3, 5 and 7 Braeview students will be bringing home this week their NAPLAN results. It is important to understand that these assessments are one measure of how a student is going and need to be considered along with other assessments and teacher judgement.

In reading and numeracy our Year 3, 5 and 7 results have demonstrated improvement in reading with the mean score for the Year 3 (band 4 to 5) and 7 students (band 6 to 7) moving into the next band. The Year 5 mean, while improving remained in the same band, band 6.

In maths the Year 3 and 7 mean scores improved with the Year 7 students moving into the next band (band 6 to 7). The Year 5 results decreased slightly but remained in the same band (band 5).

Nearly all students who were in the Upper two bands in years 3 and 5 have remained in upper bands two years later. This has been an area our Partnership has focussed on, retaining students in the upper bands. 53% of our Year 3 students who sat the reading test achieved scores in the upper two bands while in maths it was 31%. In year 5 for reading 30% were in the upper two bands and for maths it was 20%. In year 7 we had 27% achieve in the upper two bands for reading and 22% for maths.

Teachers have discussed and been given a copy of our students' results. Overall our results are solid and demonstrate the quality teaching that students receive. If you have any questions about your child's results please arrange a time with their teacher to discuss.

Monique Parsons has been told by her obstetrician to take it easy and rest. Therefore she will not be returning to Braeview to teach the Year 5/6 class. We wish Monique all the best during her latter stages of pregnancy and birth of her child. Monique's replacement, until the end of the year, will be Katrina Corbett, Katrina will begin on Monday. Katrina was to teach Shane Kelsey's Year 6/7 class for the remainder of the term, this will now be Kenneth Griffin. We wish Kenneth all the best during this time with the Year 6/7 class.

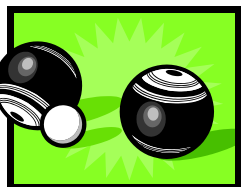

May contain the following products or their derivatives. Soya, eggs, dairy, gluten.

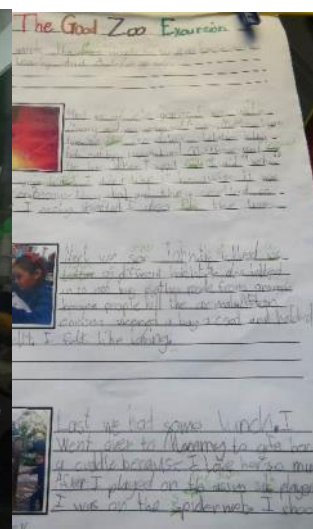
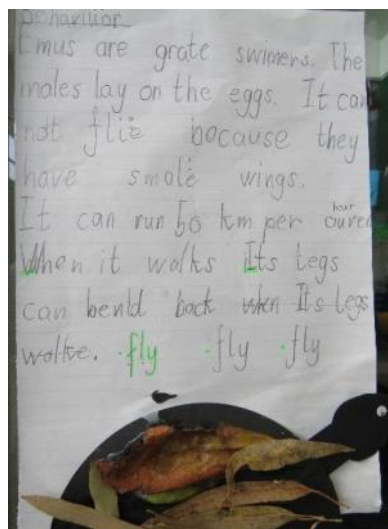
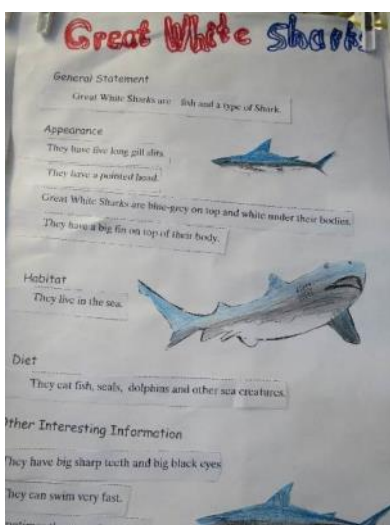
Around LA2 – Reception/ Year 1 Classes
