If your child is going to attend your local secondary school then everything is fine and you don't need to do anything. However, if you want your child to have the opportunity to attend Aberfoyle Secondary School (Ignite Program), Mitcham Girls High School, Urrbrae Agricultural High School or Brighton Secondary School (music / volleyball) then your child may need to achieve specific enrolment criteria to make this possible. Other secondary schools have specific programmes where selection criteria needs to be achieved. Many of these schools have Open Nights where parents can find out more information about the school and the protocols for applying. This information can be obtained via the secondary school or via our Front Office, when it becomes available. A secondary school pack will be sent home with your child later in the year but entrance to specialist schools often needs to be considered well before this.
