from the Principal's Desk

Good relationships within the school community are the basis of a successful school. However sometimes issues arise between students at school or between parent and teacher. Issues that arise at school between students need to be dealt with at school by the students involved in a restorative manner where the problem is looked at and how it has affected other students. Our focus is always aimed at re-establishing positive relationships between the students. Parents should encourage their child to raise the problem with their teacher and support them during its resolution.

If parents have issues with a teacher they should arrange a time to discuss what the issue is with the teacher concerned and work towards a satisfactory resolution. Braeview's teachers have always been accommodating in finding time to speak with parents, arrange a time rather than expect the teacher to interrupt their planning time in the morning.

Using social media to highlight issues students or parents have with the school isn't useful. The issue will only be described from one perspective and doesn't seek to find a solution but rather inflame the issue. Also it becomes difficult to tell students not to use social media for negative reasons when parents model this behaviour.

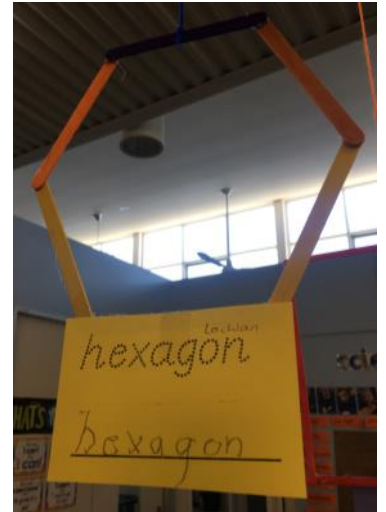

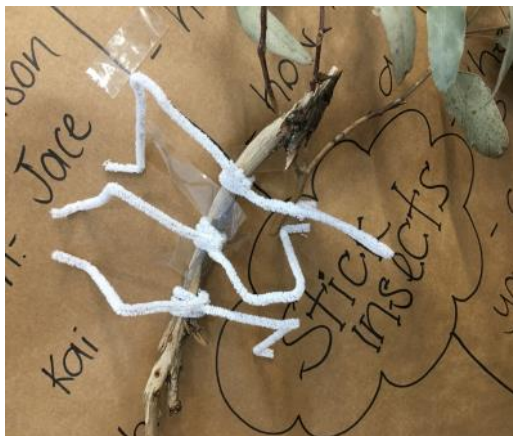
