Notes on Noticing

When you arrive in a new school you see it with new eyes. You notice things others may not and it's worth taking note of that. I was sharing this idea with the Governing Council Executive and they asked that I share some of those observations with the rest of the community.

Braeview is well resourced.

There are beautiful open spaces to play, run and learn and so many of these have been enhanced spectacularly with careful planting, multilevel walls for climbing, colour, interest, art, mosaics, trees, shrubs – and the kitchen garden is prolific and plentiful – teeming with growth and life. The playgrounds are many and varied with hard and soft surfaces, sand and soil, timber and natural materials alongside manmade surfaces. People have taken time to consider the learners in these spaces.

The classrooms are well cared for and showcase student learning. There is contemporary technology access a-plenty whenever and wherever students need it. Rooms are equipped with ICT that supports teacher pedagogy and student learning with visual, audio and multimedia tools – hover cams, sound field systems.

The human resourcing is above and beyond and this is where a school is able to make a real difference – there are so many parent volunteers and committed staff; both teaching and paraprofessionals working together in the best interests of students. To watch the sensitivity with which these professionals manage the differing needs of each student is what builds the capacity of the whole community. The students too have a positive disposition of welcoming difference and of understanding and accepting diversity which is commendable. The equity exists in every child getting what they need, not getting the same – this is evident in so many ways. From support time in and out of class to the delightful reminders about appropriate manners needed in interactions and greetings in the front office. The whole community cares for every student and is aware of what works and what doesn't for each of them in their beautiful and diverse personalities.

I have the joyous opportunity now to support these staff and students in the next stage of development as we explore and inquire further using integrated STEM ideas, processes and principles.


