Braeview has participated in an external review this week where two review officers discussed a variety of aspects of our school's work with students, staff and parents. A document will be produced that outlines key directions for our school across the three lines of inquiry, these directions must be actioned by the school over the next few years. I would like to thank all parents who participated in the review for making the time to meet with the review officers and also for the feedback they provided. When I receive the final document it will be placed on the school's website so all members of the school community can access it.

One component of the review was a discussion around our attendance policy. We still have a number of students whose attendance is marked by chronic absences, students who have missed multiple days last term and also in previous years. All students need to attend regularly, unless ill, in order to participate in the teaching and learning programme which is key to their achievement. Currently, parents receive a text message to the parents of students who are absent for reasons for the absence but the chronic non attendees are students who regularly miss blocks of days. I have recently passed on to the school's Attendance Officer the details of these chronic non attendees, she will action them in the desire to get them to attend school on a regular basis.

Our next major fundraising event will be our Father's Day stall and raffle in Term 3.



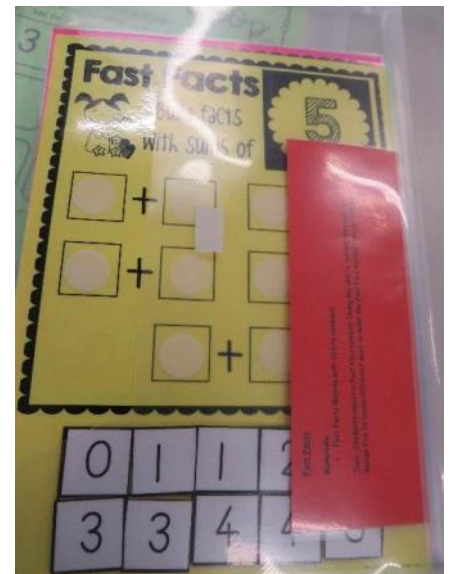
Around the Classrooms
