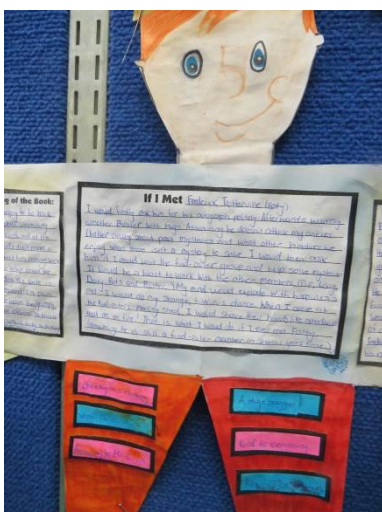


Early Writing

A Focus of Writing

Our last Pupil Free Day was 'Seven Steps to Writing Success'. Teachers implement writing lessons during their literacy block. Usually teachers spend a block of time teaching specific text type structures: narratives, recounts, expositions, explanations and reports. A major focus is developing clarity in expressing ideas in structured sentences. Prior to writing students need opportunities to share their ideas orally. During the writing process students have opportunities to edit their work to check for clarity and then again during a conference with the teacher.
